This talk by author Louise V. North will concentrate on the works of Thomas Cole, Asher B. Durand, Frederick Church, Winslow Homer among others, and will explore how these artists conveyed the almost mythic splendor of the American landscape, and then coped with encroaching civilization in this “American Paradise.”

Louise North holds degrees in art history from Barnard College and Columbia University. An independent scholar, Ms. North is the author of *The Travel Journals of Henrietta Marchant Liston, North America and Lower Canada, 1796-1800* (Lexington Books, 2014). She is a co-author, with Landa M. Freeman and Janet M. Wedge, of *Selected Letters of John Jay and Sarah Livingston Jay* (McFarland Publishers, 2005), and *In the Words of Women the American Revolution and the Birth of the Nation 1765-1799* (Lexington Books, 2011).
