Greenland is the largest island in the world, since most people consider Australia a continent and not an island. It is also the least populated country in the world. Its name is really a misnomer! Greenland has the second largest ice field in the world. Only Antarctica is larger. Greenland was named by Eric the Red.

We will explore only the south eastern part of Greenland. Our first city to visit is Kulusuk. In the summer, temperatures usually are in the 45-55 degree range. Next we take a helicopter ride to Ammassalik Island. The beautifully colored icebergs will remind you of Antarctica! A real highlight will be a boat ride from Tasiilaq (the largest city in Ammassalik) to view striped icebergs up close! They are very rare to see in either the Arctic or Antarctica! No trip to Greenland is complete without an Inuit Drum Dance!!!



You will be mesmerized by the scenery and see how different it is from Iceland! I always love to visit the Arctic (North Pole, Svalbard and Franz Joseph Islands)! Please join me for a real adventure.
