ICELAND... In the past decade, Iceland has become a major tourist destination for Americans! And well it should!! Iceland is Mother Nature at her very best! The name Iceland, however, could be misleading. There are many awesome glaciers and icebergs in Iceland. But, Iceland is not an island covered completely in ice, but an island of geology! The diversity of the landscape is what makes tourists marvel at what they are seeing. We will view many volcanoes (22 active ones!), scenic lava fields, huge waterfalls, geysers, 250 geothermal areas, hot springs, and bubbling mud pots just to name a few! And to visit Iceland in mid June–July is a



treat for photographers and non-photographers alike. The weather during this time is not as cold as many Americans think!

We will begin our trip to Iceland in Reykjavik, the capital. There are many beautiful churches here and a vibrant

night life in the warmer months of June, July and August. Then, we go on a tour of the Golden Circle. We will see Great Geysir (from which all other geysers got their name!!), Strokkur, and Gullfoss, Iceland's largest waterfall. Naturally, no tour of the Golden Circle is complete without a visit to the Blue Lagoon. Have your bathing suits ready!



We then will go North to Myvatn to observe puffins. Another “must” visit in this area is Dalvik (or Husavik) to charter a boat and go whale-watching (minke and humpback whales). In June and July, daily sightings are almost guaranteed! If you want to witness sights that you will marvel at for quite a while, please join me on this wonderful adventure.
